Targeted academic support for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Reading	Use trained adult support on a 1:1 and small group basis to improve fluency in reading and reading skills, (including phonetic de-coding skills) to ensure pupil premium pupils achieve at least minimum age-related expectations.
Writing	Invest in a high-quality resource to develop pupil independence and stamina when writing, which can be used both in school and at home to support remote learning. Additional feedback and pre- teaching support from class teacher on a weekly basis either 1:1 or small group to boost writing ability.
Maths	Use of evidence-based interventions to close the gap for identified pupil premium pupils. Invest in training and resources for First class number interventions and Sandwell assessment tool.
Phonics	In addition to the reading support detailed above, pupil premium pupils to receive additional support with phonetic decoding, led by a qualified teacher and delivered on a 1:1 and/or small group basis.

Breakfast club provision and additional pre-teaching sessions in place for identified pupils.
All pupil premium pupils able to access all additional school activities i.e. music clubs, extra- curricular sports and residential visits.
